While in Vienna you will be accommodated at the Hotel Bristol, a historic hotel dating back to 1894. The Hotel Bristol is located opposite the Vienna Opera, near the sights and sounds of this enchanting city. A fine blend of traditional elegance and Viennese hospitality, the Hotel Bristol has several dining options including the award-winning restaurant Korso bei der Oper, Sirk restaurant and Sirk cafe, as well as the American Bar.

Take time to settle into your room and perhaps enjoy lunch on your own before rejoining your group and embarking on a tour of Vienna. Board the awaiting bus and you will be driven via the Ringstrasse to Schonbrunn Palace, the summer retreat of the Habsburg dynasty, boasting 1,441 rooms! Two obelisks surmounted by golden eagles tower above the elaborate portal of this enormous yellow building. The Baroque style predominates on the outside of the Palace, while inside it flourishes with typical Rococo style.

After your tour of the palace you are transferred to the Old Town where you continue your touring on foot. Among the highlights on your walking tour is Vienna's world-famous State Opera House and St. Stephen's Cathedral. Arrive back at the hotel early evening.

MON / OCT 23 **VIENNA**

Today an excursion to Mayerling is planned. Enjoy a boat ride on the lake. Stop to see the 12th century Cistern Monastery and then finally to Mayerling, the former hunting lodge of Crown Prince Rudolph. A luncheon will also be served in a local restaurant.

The remainder of the day is free to shop and explore as you please and with your final documents you will be given sightseeing and restaurant recommendations. This evening for those who would like to attend an opera or other cultural event, tickets can be reserved. (Optional).

TUE / OCT 24 **VIENNA**

then be escorted to a private room where a champagne reception will be held and you will have an opportunity to learn more about the school and the horses.

Next you will be transferred to the palais where a private concert of the Vienna Boys Choir has been especially arranged for CSAA.

The remainder of the day is free to shop, dine and explore at your leisure and with your final documents you will be given suggestions on what you can do.

This evening an elegant dinner awaits at one of Vienna's top restaurants. Here you will enjoy the best of traditional Viennese cuisine with music of gypsy melodies (or similar) playing in the background.

WED / OCT 25 **VIENNA / SALZBURG**

This morning depart by private motorcoach for Salzburg. Travel west via the romantic Danube Valley with its ancient ruins and vineyards. This fertile area of rolling hills is considered one of the most beautiful and historic parts of Austria.

En route, you will stop for a wine tasting and lunch near the medieval village of Durnstein and then continue to Krems where you have a walking tour in one of the oldest cities in the area dating back to 995! Next is Melk, where wine-tasting is planned followed with rustic-style lunch.

After lunch you reboard the motorcoach and continue your journey to Salzburg. Situated amongst breathtaking scenery, Salzburg is considered by many visitors to be one of the most beautiful and enchanting towns in the world. Music and merriment are everywhere in Salzburg. Salzburg is also home to hundreds of churches, castles, and palaces that bear witness to its powerful archiepiscopal past. Often referred to as the "City of Mozart," Salzburg has played host to some of the world's best musical and cultural events and was the sight of the famous 1964 film, *The Sound of Music*.

Located in the center of the old town near the house where Mozart was born and the famous Festival Hall, the Goldener Hirsch boasts a rich cultural heritage dating back to 1405! The hotel is actually a composite of three interconnected medieval townhouses. Old world charm has been complemented by recent renovations making the Goldener Hirsch a fine base in Salzburg. The hotel has a formal restaurant, which is one of the most exclusive dining establishments in the city, featuring international and Austrian cuisines. There is also a casual tavern with regional specialties and a bar in a covered inner courtyard.

THU / OCT 26 **SALZBURG**

Following breakfast depart on a morning walking tour of Salzburg. Among the sights you will visit are the Hohensalzburg Fortress, a city landmark that dates back to the Middle Ages and the yellow House No.9 on Getreidegasse, the birthplace of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and now the Mozart Museum. By special appointment (pending confirmation) you will have the rare opportunity to visit Mozarteum, The building was constructed just before WWI and this was where the Salzburg Festival took place up until 1921.

This afternoon you have the option of joining a Sound of Music tour, visiting the Ice Caves or simply exploring Old Salzburg on your own. (Note: Ice Caves may not be available end of October as it is a seasonal site.)

Tonight enjoy special castle dinner will be arranged.

FRI / OCT 27 **SALZBURG / CESKY BUDEJOVICE**

After breakfast you depart by motorcoach and travel north approximately 100 miles into the Czech Republic. Continue another 30 miles to the visit the neo-Gothic Hluboka Castle. This is one of several castles owned by the Bavarian Schwarzenbergs. This is one of the Czech Republic' most elaborate and curious castles.

Next you stop in Ceske Budejovice, an ancient town with one of Europe's biggest market squares. Here, you will visit the Budvar Brewery and sample its celebrated beer as well enjoy a special luncheon where beer will be the key ingredient.

After your festive afternoon at the brewery you will be transferred to the four-star Zvon hotel in Ceske Budejovice.

Settle into your rooms and enjoy dinner at the hotel.

SAT / OCT 28

**CESKY BUDEJOVICE / CESKY KRUMLOV /
PRAGUE**

After breakfast, check out of the hotel and you will be driven to Cesky Krumlov where you will embark on a walking tour.

Cesky Krumlov is a storybook medieval village with its picturesque square, tranquil river, and spectacular castle – the entire town was added to UNESCO's World Heritage list in 1992. You will visit the castle, an imposing structure that rivals all but Prague Castle in opulence. As you cross the moat, look down as you may catch a glimpse of the brown bears that now call the castle home!

Reboard the coach and you will be driven north to Prague stopping in Tabor **or** Tebron.

Tabor rises above luxuriant slopes falling deep into the Luznice River. The beauty of Tabor is its Renaissance buildings and associations with the Hussite movement. Tabor is one of Southern Bohemia's loveliest towns.

Tebron was first settled in the 13th century by the Wittkowitzes (later Rosenbergs), who were one of Bohemia's noblest families. During the 15th and 16th centuries the Rosenbergs peppered the surrounding countryside with over 6,000 ponds and today Tebron is the county's fishing center. (Note: Late autumn is harvest time and you may have an opportunity to see how the fish is netted). Enjoy a walking tour followed with lunch.

Your journey continues north to Prague with one more stop along the way. You will visit Konopiste Castle, a lovely hunting castle built in the 13th century located an hour outside of Prague.

Back in the motorcoach you continue into Prague where you will be accommodated at the deluxe Four Seasons Hotel. Rising from the banks of the celebrated Vltava River, the Four Seasons Hotel has an ideal location set within the Staré Mesto, the historic, cultural and economic heart of the city. The hotel is connected by three historic structures with a contemporary building, a magnificent blending of five centuries of architecture! The Four Seasons Prague boasts highly personal service, modern amenities and tomorrow's technology.

TUE / OCT 31 PRAGUE

Today another interesting day is planned. Begin with a visit of Terezin, a fortress and former concentration camp located approximately 50 miles from Prague. Built in 1780, the Small Fortress, or the Theresinstadt, originated as a political prison during the Hapsburg Empire. The Small Fortress did not truly earn its notoriety until the arrival of the Nazis in 1940. Creating a “police prison” headed by Heinrich Jockel, the Nazis cleared the town of Terezin by 1941, establishing a Jewish Ghetto in the process. About 250,000 Jews were interred here, of which a suspected 80,000 were sent to Auschwitz, Treblinka and Majdanek.

Back in Prague you have the remainder of the day free to shop and enjoy as you please.

Tonight a special farewell dinner will be arranged in 17th-century restaurant.
