## Half Day Tours



**Saturday, November 4, 2006**

8:00am - 12:30pm

### On and Off the Beaten Track – walking tour

Explore the wondrous city on this walking tour in the heart of Rome. Visit the Campo Dei Fiori, site of a colorful out-door medieval market where today housewives still shop for fresh food; the Pantheon, with its unique immense dome unchanged since 125 AD; the Piazza Navona embellished with Bernini’s Baroque fountain of the Four Rivers; and the Trevi Fountain where Gregory Peck and Audrey Hepburn frolicked in the movie *Roman Holiday*. Don’t forget to throw a coin over your shoulder to ensure your return to Rome.

### St. Paul’s Basilica, Catacombs and Old Appian Way

Visit St. Paul’s Outside the Walls, the largest Basilica in Rome after St. Peter’s, with its charming cloisters. Then drive along the Appian Way, which is the oldest paved road in the world, on your way to the Catacombs, located just outside the City Walls. The Catacombs consist of an intriguing maze of underground tunnels hollowed out of volcanic rock, where the early Christians who were persecuted by the Romans had to practice their religious rites and bury their dead in secret.

### St. Peter’s Basilica and Tombs of the Popes

Visit the world’s largest church, the heart of the Catholic Church and repository of some of mankind’s most glorious artistic creations, including Michelangelo’s “Pietà”; Bernini’s Baldacchino, a massive, spiral-columned canopy which rises over the papal altar; and the splendid gilt-bronze Cattedra di San Pietro (throne of St. Peter). You’ll also visit the underground tombs of the Popes where you can look down on the very tomb of St. Peter.

**Wednesday, November 8, 2006**

### Imperial Rome

This tour includes the Coliseum, where heroic gladiators and fierce animals challenged each other until death for the pleasure of the Emperor and the public; the Forum, the heart and center of ancient Rome; and the Arch of Titus, which commemorates the Emperor’s victory over Jerusalem in 72AD. Then drive by Palatine Hill and the Circus Maximus, site of ancient chariot races; and the Piazza Venezia with its enormous white marble monument to King Victor Emmanuel II.

### La Vigna Winery and Medieval Town of Orvieto, full day tour with lunch

Travel north toward Florence to the charming La Vigna Winery, opened exclusively for CSAA. Nestled in the hills and overlooking breathtaking mountains and gorges, you'll tour this private winery and its intimate, candlelit, vaulted wine cellar where recordings of the great Italian opera diva, Maria Callas, are played to create the perfect atmosphere for the wine to age.

Sample some of the winery's award winning wines before traveling on to the medieval town of Orvieto, home to the famous Orvieto white wine. You'll marvel at this quaint medieval town with its narrow cobblestone streets and the breathtaking mosaic-covered 12th century Duomo rising from the square. Visit the shops displaying Orvieto's famous hand-painted ceramics, Pinocchio dolls, antiques and artisan jewelry, relax in an outdoor café in the splendid medieval atmosphere, or capture this wonderful town on film. If



you liked the scenery in Diane Lane's recent movie, *Under the Tuscan Sun*, this tour is a must for you.

A 3-course meal, with ½ bottle of wine, is included in the tour. You will dine at Maurizio Al Duomo, located in a magnificent medieval building just a few steps from the cathedral. The restaurant offers traditional Umbrian cuisine and features a beautiful wine cellar with a vast selection of wines (including their own production), among which the world-renowned "Orvieto Classico" keeps its honored place.

### Tivoli, Villa D'Este and Villa Adrian, full day tour with lunch



Travel east of Rome to Tivoli. Here you will find the Villa Adrian (Hadrian's Villa) built from AD 125 to 134. Sacked by the barbarians and Romans alike after the death of the Emperor Hadrian in AD 138, the expansive ruins, revealed in a government organized excavation of Tivoli in 1870, remain compelling. Included among the villa's ruins is the water-filled Pecile, taking its name from a portico in Athens, which was built in the shape of a large rectangle with slightly curved ends, oriented so that one side was always in the shade. At the southern end of Hadrian's Villa is an incredible copy of the Temple of Serapis that will transport you back to the time of the Egyptians.

Then travel on to the Villa d'Este, a late-Renaissance estate manifested in the 80-some fountains of all shapes and sizes that tumble down the vast, steep hillside garden. Cardinal Ippolito d'Este (1509-72), an active figure in the political intrigues of mid-16th century Italy, set about proving his dominance over man and nature by commissioning this exuberant monument to architectural excess. Included in the tour is a delicious 3-course Italian meal, with ½ bottle of wine, at Restaurant La Sibilla, housed in an early 18th century building with a charming panoramic view over Villa Gregoriana and Tivoli's famous waterfalls.
