Diamond Head Crater Summit Nature Walk

Saturday, October 22, 2005

Learn the fascinating history of this extinct volcanic crater on a professional guided walk to Point Leahi at the crater's summit. Learn about the ancient Hawaiian myths and legends surrounding this unique natural feature, and how the crater was used by Hawaiians in historic times. Your guides will point out unique plant and bird species that inhabit the crater and provide an informative narration during the walk to the summit.

Along the way, you will visit and learn the history of the military bunkers and facilities that were constructed near the summit during WWII, and how the crater is currently used by military and government agencies. From Point Leahi, you will enjoy a panoramic view over the famous Waikiki and Kahala coasts, the world-class windsurfing beaches at the foot of the crater, and (on clear days) the neighboring islands of Molokai and Lanai.

Your tour includes: roundtrip transportation; admission fee; bottled water; use of a backpack, hiking pole and binoculars; Diamond Head certificate; boxed lunch under the trees at Kapiolani Park; guide gratuity; and all applicable taxes.

Priority order will be assigned as forms are received. Once the first minimum is achieved an additional 9 persons must sign up before the second van can be offered and so on to a tour maximum of 48 persons). Minimum number of 9 must be met 30 days in advance or tour will be cancelled.

Note: This is an easy hike but a good aerobic workout; thus, guests with high blood pressure, heart condition, or women more than 3 months pregnant are advised to avoid this activity. Hiking boots or sneakers, shorts, t-shirt and sunscreen are recommended.

Dolphin Snorkel Sail

Sunday, October 23, 2005

There are many species of dolphins swimming the tepid waters of Hawaii. The most common are the Hawaiian spinner, so called for their high, spinning leaps; spinner dolphins are known as playful, eager bow-riders. Board the 53-foot Ko Olina Catamaran and begin your quest to spot a dolphin pod. The spinner dolphins visit the Leeward Coast daily and usually can be found within 20 to 30 minutes of sail. Once found, passengers stand watch from a mere 4 feet above the water, while the dolphins frolic, jump and swim. Continue your afternoon with snorkeling in the warm, crystal clear coastal waters of the leeward coast. The waters abound with colorful schools of striped Manini, buttercup Yellow Tang, the stunning Moorish Idols and the opalescent Parrotfish.

Your tour includes: roundtrip transportation to the Ko Olina Marina; a boxed lunch; two (2) complimentary alcoholic beverages per adult; snorkel equipment and instructions; crew gratuity; harbor fees; and all applicable taxes.
