Honeywell International and United Technologies Corporation Confirm Discussions

Security Sales reports that **Honeywell Intl. Inc.** is on the brink of being bought by United Technologies Corp. for about \$40 billion in an all-stock transaction. United Technologies Chairman and CEO George David would be the CEO of the combined company, while Honeywell Chairman and CEO **Michael Bonsignore** would become Chairman, according to the business cable network **CNBC**. The deal could be announced as soon as this weekend.

Honeywell confirmed that they are in discussions regarding a possible business combination, but indicated that both companies would have no further comment at this time.

United Technologies provides high technology products to the aerospace and building systems industries throughout the world. UTC's companies include Pratt & Whitney, Carrier, Otis, International Fuel Cells, Hamilton Sundstrand, and Sikorsky.
